Learning and the Curriculum	The College offers a differentiated curriculum for all students and this is reviewed to ensure it meets the needs of all individuals. We use resources tailored to the needs of students who require support to access the curriculum. Targets are set effectively and curriculum progress is tracked for all students. Staff receive training and are confident with Equality Diversity and Inclusion (EDI).

	Keeping safe is been embedded into the curriculum. Tutors plan and deliver a variety of enrichment days related to EDI, religious festivals and British Values.
Transitions	Transition arrangements for new students enrolling at the College are personalised and developed in consultation with feeder schools. Students transitioning on from the College are supported to undertake transition visits whilst reducing College attendance in their final year, increasing attendance at their next destination. Strong partnerships with SEN schools and social care providers in both Worcestershire and neighbouring local authorities. All students transition out of College with a comprehensive Transition Passport.
