We all had a fantastic afternoon and look forward to working with our Community Champions in the New Year on lots of exciting projects and opportunities for students.







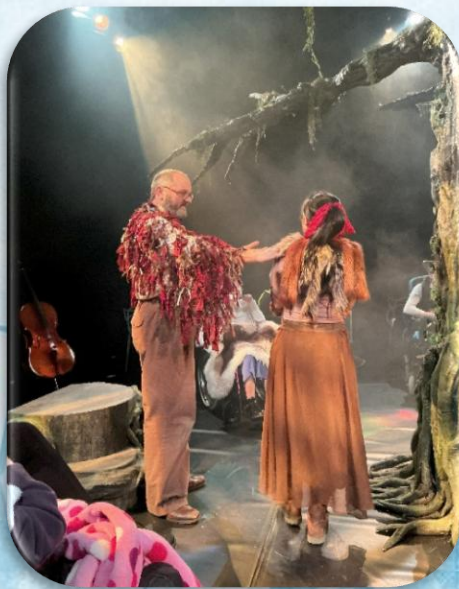
## THE ARTS: FROZEN LIGHTS TRIP

## LINK PROJECT: CHRISTMAS STORY MESSAGE

This term we welcomed five visiting pupils from Chadsgrove School as part of our link project program. Together, we planned and filmed a Christmas-themed Story Massage to a festive song, using a green-screen backdrop.

Story Massage uses a sequence of simple, agreed touch cues alongside spoken words and music. It supports shared attention, sensory regulation and communication, and gives students a meaningful role in a group performance.

Students took part in the planning stage by making choices, agreeing the actions, and practicing the sequence. Filming took place using our college camera, and the final video was edited in DaVinci Resolve.

All Story Massage activities took place in line with individual care plans and paying close attention to the need for consent. Throughout, staff ensured students were comfortable, happy and able to participate in a way that suited them. It was a brilliant example of creativity, teamwork and inclusive communication.

We recently had the pleasure of welcoming Chanika, a Co-production Officer from Voices United Worcestershire, to one of our Student Ambassador meetings.






We pride ourselves on empowering student voice, so it was fantastic to hear how Chanika supports young people to be heard and valued in decisions that directly affect them.

## WELL-BEING: EXPLORERS

This half term, Explorers have been enjoying seasonal sensory stories as part of their well-being sessions. Each session has followed a familiar, calming routine, with students exploring a range of autumn-themed sensory experiences such as crunchy leaves, conkers, pine cones, cinnamon and other warm scents, soft fabric textures, wind sounds, gentle light effects, and autumn colours.

Students have been encouraged to communicate their preferences throughout, using their voice, facial expressions, gesture, symbols and assistive technology where appropriate. It has been fantastic to see clear communication about what they like and don't like, with staff supporting students to make choices, request "more" or "stop", and show anticipation as familiar parts of the story returned each week.

Everyone has been fully engaged throughout the sessions, with students sustaining attention for longer periods, exploring new stimuli at their own pace, and enjoying the shared experience with their peers. These sensory stories have supported emotional regulation, confidence, and purposeful communication, and have been a lovely way to celebrate the season together.







## WELL-BEING: SEEKERS

This half term, our Seekers have been taking part in dedicated well-being sessions designed to help them slow down, reflect, and build positive habits for both mind and body.

Each week, the class gathers for a calm and focused lesson centered around meditation and mindfulness. We begin by checking in with the group and celebrating the good things students have done.

Through guided breathing and mindful reflection, students are learning techniques they can take beyond the classroom. It has been wonderful to see them developing greater self-awareness and sharing their own views on how they are progressing and what they would like to improve.
